<p>4<sup>TH</sup> District Update</p>	<p>Merrill E. Baker, III, Deputy Director of Operations for the City of Richmond Department of Public Works reported that Forest Hill and the surrounding neighborhoods will have a two-cycle leaf collection program. He provided a map showing schedule 1. Our first collection is on 12/28 to 12/31. He also discussed the transition to larger trucks for trash collection. <b>Smaller trucks will still be used for alley collection spots.</b></p>
<p>Park Improvement Committee (PIC Forest Hill)</p>	<p>Robley Jones reported that J.R. Pope of Parks and Recreation had not determined the date of the grand opening of Forest Hill Park Lake.</p>

	<p>Plans for the Forest Hill Yacht Club Regatta are being developed. Entries for the Yacht Club logo contest will be judged at the January FHNA. Volunteers signed up for the PIC Committee.</p>
Social Committee	<p>Dorna Braswell reported that the 43rd St. Festival was a GREAT DAY for FHNA. We sold 12 memberships, 6 Flags, 41 shirts (old ones @ \$5.00), 1 hat and 23 House Tour Tickets.</p> <p>The House Tour had over 300 Attendees On the day of the tour almost 1/2 of our tickets (137) sold. The ticket sale locations sold 80 tickets with top sales from Crossroads &amp; 43rd St. Gallery Total Income \$6,595.00 - Estimated revenue \$3,000</p>
Membership Committee	<p>Peter Hubbell reported that we are up to 185 members. Twenty-five memberships will be expiring within the next 60 days. The committee is sending renewal forms to those twenty-five families.</p>
Neighborhood Watch Committee	<p>Lieutenant John A. O’Kleasky, Jr., reported that robberies are down 10%, and burglaries are down 43%. He discussed the vandalism incident in the park.</p> <p>O’Kleasky emphasized the need to lock cars. There have been a number of items stolen from vehicles.</p>
Historic Designation	<p>Carolyn Paulette reported that she had met with Nancy Crouse who worked on the Woodland Heights historic designation. Crouse expressed a willingness to assist with the Forest Hill efforts.</p> <p>Those working on this project were to meet on 10/27.</p>
Announcements	<p>A representative of the City will be at the next meeting to present information regarding the proposed traffic circle at Roanoke and Forest Hill. There was much discussion regarding this announcement.</p> <p>Monica Rumsey announced the October 17 Friends of Forest Hill Park cleanup.</p>
